Dear Parents and Community Members,

This report card is issued by the Oregon Department of Education. It provides a detailed picture of what Vern Patrick Elementary School offers to our students.

In 2013-2014, we received an Overall State Rating of Level 3. This means that our students are performing at an average range on standards-based tests when compared to other schools in the state. Students are also demonstrating above average growth in reading.

Key academic highlights:

- 63% met or exceeded state standards for reading.
- Above average student growth for underserved races/ethnicities in mathematics.

To enhance growth in mathematics, we will focus our resources on the Common Core State Standards (CCCS) and begin a "March to Math" program which will ensure students receive support with difficult math skills. We will continue our "Walk to Read" program with academic support and enrichment programs.

We promise to deliver the excellence you have come to expect from us at Vern Patrick Elementary School. We look forward to partnering with you to make sure all of our students reach their potential!






OVERALL STATE RATING

HOW ARE STUDENTS AT THIS SCHOOL PERFORMING COMPARED TO THOSE AT OTHER SCHOOLS?


The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2013-14, this school is rated as Level 3.




- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
- Level 2** = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
- Level 3** = Falls between 15% and 44% of schools
- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
- Level 5** = Falls into the top 10% of schools

CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

SCHOOL READINESS

- Walk to Read Program - daily reading instruction for each student.
- School-wide events & outreach to promote focus on literacy at home.
- Extended Day Kindergarten offers additional ½ day.
- Parent education programs offered in after school programming.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- Students at risk of academic failure get additional daily instruction.
- Special Education services provided for students with disabilities.
- Interdisciplinary team planning to support individual students.
- Counseling services offered to eliminate mental health barriers.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- Differentiated instruction to meet the needs of advanced learners.
- After school programs to include chess club, student council.
- La Clase for Spanish speaking students.
- Community Service projects.
- Science, historical figure and business fairs
- SMART Reader Program
