Dear Parents and Community Members,

This report card is issued by the Oregon Department of Education. It provides a detailed picture of what M.A. Lynch Elementary School offers to our students.

In 2014-2015, we received an Overall State Rating of 3. We received a 4 for overall reading growth. Our math overall achievement is a level 2 which reflects our focus during the 2013-2014 year on the new CCSS Math Standards.

Key academic highlights:

- 12% more English Language Learners (ELL) students met the benchmark for math.

- 4% more students with disabilities met the benchmark for math

During the 2014-2015 school year, we will implement new standards for both math and english language arts. Students will also take a new state assessment that will assess the new standards.

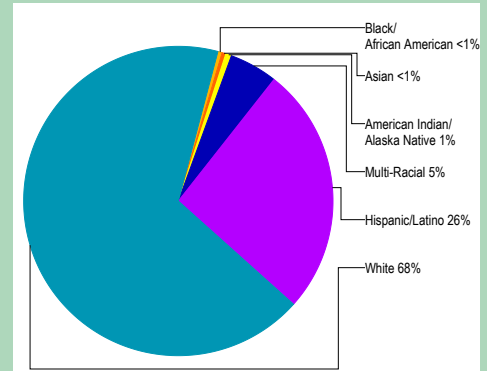

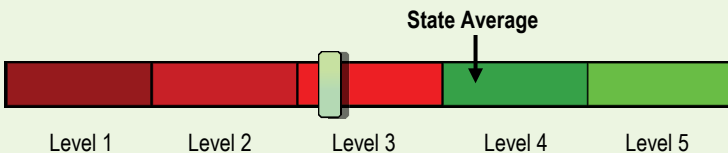


OVERALL STATE RATING

HOW ARE STUDENTS AT THIS SCHOOL PERFORMING COMPARED TO THOSE AT OTHER SCHOOLS?

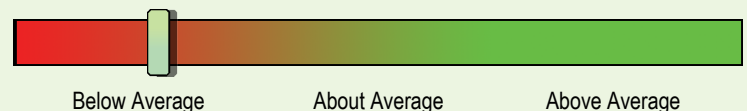
The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. Please be aware that this rating is based mainly on high-stakes testing and accordingly, represents a limited view of student performance. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2013-14, this school is rated as Level 3.



- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
- Level 2** = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
- Level 3** = Falls between 15% and 44% of schools
- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
- Level 5** = Falls into the top 10% of schools

Compared to elementary schools with similar student demographics in 2013-14, this school's rating is below average.



- Below average** = Falls into the bottom third of comparison schools
- About average** = Falls into the middle third of comparison schools
- Above average** = Falls into the top third of comparison schools

CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

SCHOOL READINESS

At Lynch know that when students come prepared to learn they succeed. To support our families, we offer an Extended-Day Kindergarten Program for identified students.

We offer Universal Breakfast/Lunch, an onsite Head Start, and a Family Health Clinic.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Lynch provides academic support in the after school programs as well as a part of the regular school day. Students who need support in reading, receive support through our Title I Reading programs and through our Walk to Strategies (W2S) program. Lynch also provides strong support for students with disabilities and English Language Learners.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Lynch is a Full Service Community School. We host an onsite Family Health Clinic and Head Start. We partner with the community to provide after school enrichment opportunities through our Cub Club. Students get the extra support by attending homework club or more intensive math and reading interventions. They can also participate in a variety of enrichment programs to include Robotics, Chess Club, Photography, as well as STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) programs. Science Inquiry week occurs each May and culminates with Science Inquiry Night. Lynch also has a Talented and Gifted (TAG) Program.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES/ AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Lynch hosts a variety of family activities. The PTO hosts Family Fun Nights throughout the year. Each May, students develop and share science inquiry projects in our annual Science

Inquiry Night. Lynch also hosts Family Literacy Nights and Cub Club Showcases.
