FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

This report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education is an overview of what Sage Elementary offers to students. Last year, students in 3rd-5th grade took the Smarter Balanced Assessment for the third time in reading and math. Sage fifth grade students were also assessed by taking the OAKS Science Assessment. Sage was not given an overview rating for the 2016-17 school year. However, student progress and outcomes were rated and compared to other schools in Oregon.

Key Academic Highlights:

- In reading Sage's students' scores are 22% above the state of Oregon average.
- In math Sage's students' scores are 18% above the state of Oregon average.
- In Science, Sage's students' score are 11% above the state of Oregon average.

The scores from Smarter Balanced Assessment for the 2016-17 school year will give Sage valuable data to create, plan and implement high quality instruction for

each student in the areas of English Language Arts, Math, and Science. We will deliver the same excellence you have come to expect from Sage Elementary.

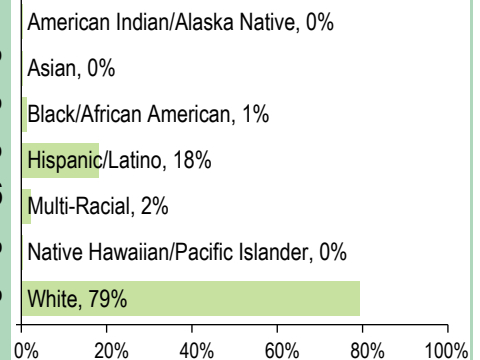
